




#### Directions for use:


There are several ways this workbook could be used.

- 1. These handwriting pages are made for preschool age children or children with special needs still developing fine motor skills. Children will enjoy doing these pages over and over again. To save paper. Print out entire document. Laminate pages, punch holes and bind together with rings, a folder with prongs, or a notebook. Then practice writing letters with children using a wet-erase marker. (dry-erase can work too, it is just a little harder to get off sometimes on laminating paper.)
- 2. If you do not have access to a laminator, but would like to make these reusable there are 2 easy ways to do it.
  - 1. You can buy self-seal laminating pouches in full letter size. This will work just like a laminator and is really easy to do. Bind pages together, then use wet-erase markers like above.
  - 2. Also you can buy a package or the clear sheet protectors. Slide pages in them and put them in a notebook. Children can use wet or dry-erase markers on these as well. Be careful cleaning these as water can sometimes get inside the sheet protectors.
- 3. These can also be used as worksheets or practice pages with paper and pencil as well. Simply make copies as needed for students, and read stories to students for letter formation.
- 4. The pictures in this file are left black and white so children can color the pictures as well as practice writing.
- 5. Start with instructional pages on straight, curved, and diagonal lines so that children will understand how to form the letters that follow.
- 6. As you work through pages with children, read the directions, to teach children how to form the letters. If you are using this in a classroom, you could project this PDF on a SmartBoard (or other device), and demonstrate to the children how to write the letters on this while they use the pages you've given them.
- 7. Have fun!











A lot of letters have circles in them. Start at the circle and draw a round shape like my wheels.






## Lowercase a's with Alex the airplane




# Lowercase c's with Carly the car








# Lowercase e's with Edgar the elephant
